Dickinson County Board of Supervisors June 27, 2017

9:00 A.M. Present are Supervisors Mardi Allen, Tim Fairchild, Vice-Chairperson Pam Jordan and Chairperson William Leupold. Supervisor Paul Johnson arrived at 9:25 a.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present.

Meeting called to order by Chairperson, William Leupold.

Matt Richter and Charly Whittenburg present representing the Historic Arnolds Park Inc. An overview of the 12 million dollar fundraising campaign to renovate and restore the amusement park, buildings, structures and grounds was presented.

Moved by Allen, seconded by Fairchild, to approve and adopt RESOLTION 2017-12 WHEREAS, the iconic Arnolds Park Amusement Park, under the direction of the board of directors of Historic Arnolds Park, Inc., has begun its 128tth year of operation; and WHEREAS, throughout its rich history, Arnolds Park Amusement Park has been an attraction for visitors both far and near, providing generations of families with lasting memories of games, thrill rides, music and more; and WHEREAS, the Arnolds Park Amusement Park has been a key component to maintaining the Lake Okoboji region as a destination site for recreation and tourism, which in 2016 say \$276.12 million in tourism generated expenditures pass through Dickinson County, producing \$4.99 million in local tax receipts, creating 1,980 tourism related jobs, and an estimated 449,111 visitors from Memorial Day through Labor Day; and WHEREAS, the Historic Arnolds Park Inc.'s board of directors has recently announced plans for a \$12 million fundraising campaign to renovate and restore the amusement park, its buildings, structures and grounds so that the Arnolds Park Amusement Park can continue to sustain its role as a destination site for the region, providing families and future generations with lasting memories as well as serve as an economic engine for the region's tourism industry; THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors applauds and supports the fundraising efforts of the board of directors of the Historic Arnolds Park, Inc. for the purpose of renovating and restoring the iconic Arnolds Park Amusement Park; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors encourages businesses and residents of our county to support the fundraising efforts of the board of directors of the Historic Arnolds Park, Inc. in a manner they deem appropriate; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors will demonstrate its support for the fundraising effort, recognizing the significant economic benefit the amusement park provides our county and the businesses and residents therein, by pledging \$5000.00 of unobligated generated revenue to be paid at \$1,000.00 per year over the period of 5 years (starting in fiscal year 2018), to assist in the renovation and restoration of the amusement park so that it may continue to serve as a catalyst for our region's tourism industry and be a destination for families and persons of all ages.

Roll call vote: Allen-aye, Fairchild-aye, Johnson-absent for vote, Jordan-aye, and Leupold-nay. Approved and passed on this 27th day of June, 2017 by the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors.

Railroad right of way; **Whereas**, the proposed trail will connect the existing trail from Peoria Avenue to Lundberg Drive in the City of Spirit Lake, and through the existing trail connect to the entire Great Lakes Trail system; **Now therefore, let it be resolved** that the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors encourages and supports the efforts of the Dickinson County Trails Board in their application for all grants to which they qualify to fund the cost of construction of this recreational trail. Let it also be known that Dickinson County will be responsible for the maintenance funding of the trail, as administered by the Dickinson County Trails Board for not less than twenty (20) years from the date of completion of this trail.
