Noxious Weed Policy 2022-8

To All Property Owners:

Be it resolved by the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors, that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa and Chapter 58 of the Iowa Administrative Code, it is hereby ordered:

That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Dickinson County shall cut, burn, or otherwise control all noxious weeds thereon as defined in this chapter, at such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth.

That it is recommended that noxious weeds be cut or otherwise controlled on or before the following dates and as often thereafter as is necessary to prevent seed production throughout the growing season. However, these are only guidelines. Weather conditions may cause weeds to mature several weeks ahead of normal and consequently require control measures prior to the listed dates.

Group 1: June 20, 2022- Leafy Spurge, Russian knapweed, Buckthorn, Multiflora rose, Quackgrass, Musk thistle

Group 2: July 18, 2022- Canada thistle, Field bindweed, Bull thistle, Purple loosestrife, Palmer amaranth, Plumeless thistle, Perennial sow thistle

That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Dickinson County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work including the costs of serving notice and other costs, if any, to be assessed against the real estate.

Complaints will be handled as follows: The complaint is to be called in or emailed to the weed commissioner with the contact information below. State the reason for the complaint, the location of the property, the noxious weeds found therein, the owners of the land and the tenants or persons in control of the land.

Moved by Clark, seconded by Wermersen, to approve ED 1 drainage claim to Lair Tiling and Excavation in the amount of \$465. Roll call vote: Clark-aye, Wermersen-aye, Thee-aye, Fairchild-aye, and Leupold-aye.

Emmet County Supervisors Jeff Quastad, Todd Glasnapp, John Pluth, Tim Schumacher, and Lisa K Hansen were present via Zoom to discuss ED3 assessments, crop damage and right-of-way payments. The temporary right-of-way for crop damage payment was discussed. Reclassification for the old ED3 to be added to the new schedule was also reviewed. Motion Tim Schumacher, second by Steve Clark to approve ED3 crop damage payments. All Ayes, motion carried.

Dan Eckert, County Engineer, present. Moved by Wermersen, seconded by Thee, to make a recommendation to approve the placement of a 720KV underground wire bored under 140th street for a new service line. The bore will be four feet below the ditch grade in section #29 and #32 of Diamond Lake Township. Roll call vote: Wermersen-aye, Thee-aye, Clark-aye, Fairchild-aye, and Leupold-aye.

Moved by Fairchild, seconded by Clark, to make a recommendation to approve the placement of fiber optic cable for IGL Teleconnect in various locations throughout Dickinson County. The cable will be

placed in the shoulder of the roads and shall be bored under all culverts, intersections, and bridges. Dickinson County shall waive the \$1 million fee and require a map that outlines the drainage district crossings. Roll call vote: Fairchild-aye, Clark-aye, Wermersen-aye, Thee-aye, and Leupold-aye.

Eckert started out the discussion on the consideration of no parking signs on 182nd street. After further discussion, no action was taken.

The Board gave their board and committee reports and continued into general discussion. There being no further items presented to the board, moved by Thee, seconded by Fairchild, to adjourn. All voted aye. Meeting adjourned to the call of the Chairperson at 10:34 a.m.
